

Rule #10 "Don't forget to praise him."

If we are not careful, we can experience something similar after God delivers us from a Red Sea crisis. We can forget to say thank you. This week we conclude our series with Red Sea Rule #10: Don't forget to praise him.

- Read Exodus 15:1-21. What does this passage teach us about praising God?

- Read Luke 17:11-19. Only one leper returned to thank God. Why do you think there's a tendency to neglect praise and thanksgiving to God?
- Have you ever found it difficult to praise God? If so, how did you overcome that difficulty?
- What are some creative ways you can praise God throughout your day?
- Why should you praise God in the middle of your current or future Red Sea crisis?
- Share with your group how God has used this study in your current situation. Or share how it
 has prepared you for a future Red Sea crisis.
- Please provide your growth group host with honest feedback on your experience in their group.
 Simply share with them privately or publically what they did well and what could be improved.
 Also share any suggestions you might have that would encourage them as they move forward in hosting Growth Groups.
